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About the Residency Program

Good Samaritan University Hospital is the busiest Emergency Department on the south shore of Long Island, treating approximately 90,000 patients annually.

The hospital is currently engaged in a \$525 million expansion, which includes a new ED, as well as ICU, and surgical suites, expected to open in 2025.

Among our many services, Good Samaritan University Hospital is a busy, suburban, Level 1 verified Adult Trauma Center, Level 2 verified Pediatric Trauma Center, was designated a Comprehensive Stroke Center by both the Joint Commission and Department of Health, an accredited Bariatric Center by the ASMBS, a Magnet®-recognized hospital by the ANCC and has earned Commission on Cancer Full Accreditation for six surveys, spanning 18 years. The hospital is home to four St. Francis Heart Center programs, a Catholic Health Cancer Institute and the Stroke & Brain Aneurysm Center of Long Island.

We have a state-of-the-art, dedicated Pediatric Emergency Department that sees 25,000 children yearly, a dedicated Super Track treatment area and an Emergency Department run Observation Unit.

For those interested in subspecialty training, fellowship programs in Pediatric Emergency Medicine, Emergency Ultrasound, Administration and Leadership and Observation Medicine are available. To afford a diversified and well-rounded experience, the program has affiliations with the NYC Poison Control Center, FDNY/EMS, Baltimore Shock Trauma Center and Elmhurst Hospital.

Graduated clinical, academic, administrative and research skills are developed and cultivated, so that graduates will be prepared to become leaders in Emergency Medicine. The structure of the Emergency Medicine Residency Program includes strong didactics and a diverse clinical experience.

The hospital takes pride in providing residents with a balanced approach to professional and personal well-being, while encouraging community involvement.
